parents/carers have a really good look around at home and return any old school library books, school reading books that are not your child's current reading book and any school scissors that you may find, as soon as possible.



Dear Parents/Carers,

In 2016, the Manchester Diocese joined forces with the Mothers' Union, who knitted a series of nativity sets for schools to use as part of their Posada. Over 80 schools asked to take part. This year Canon Burrows are celebrating this special time of Advent with a Posada

Posada is a Spanish word that means 'inn', and is a Mexican tradition during Advent. The tradition used to be that two young people, dressed as Mary and Joseph, travelled from house to house in their village to proclaim the imminent arrival of Jesus and request that they be given a room. Today we use nativity figures and these can be passed from family to family within the school community, during Advent and returning before the last day of term ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day.

Our Posada's journey begins with a discussion about the journey that Joseph and Mary would have had to make to Bethlehem from Nazareth, how they would have had to stay with friends/relatives/strangers each night, and so on, with pupils discussing if they would have been made to feel welcome, fed, where they would have slept, etc.?

Following this, Mary and Joseph will journey to the homes of children in our school. If they visit your home, the figures can sit on the sofa to listen to a story, sit up at the table during meal times, and even be put to bed in the spare room. They travel with a box with suggestions for prayers and activities, a candle and also a journal for diary entries, photos and pictures about their activities to be slotted in. Please add to this journal and return the Posada the following day. Many thanks in anticipation of you offering your home as a host to remind us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem and to remember those in the world who have no permanent home.
